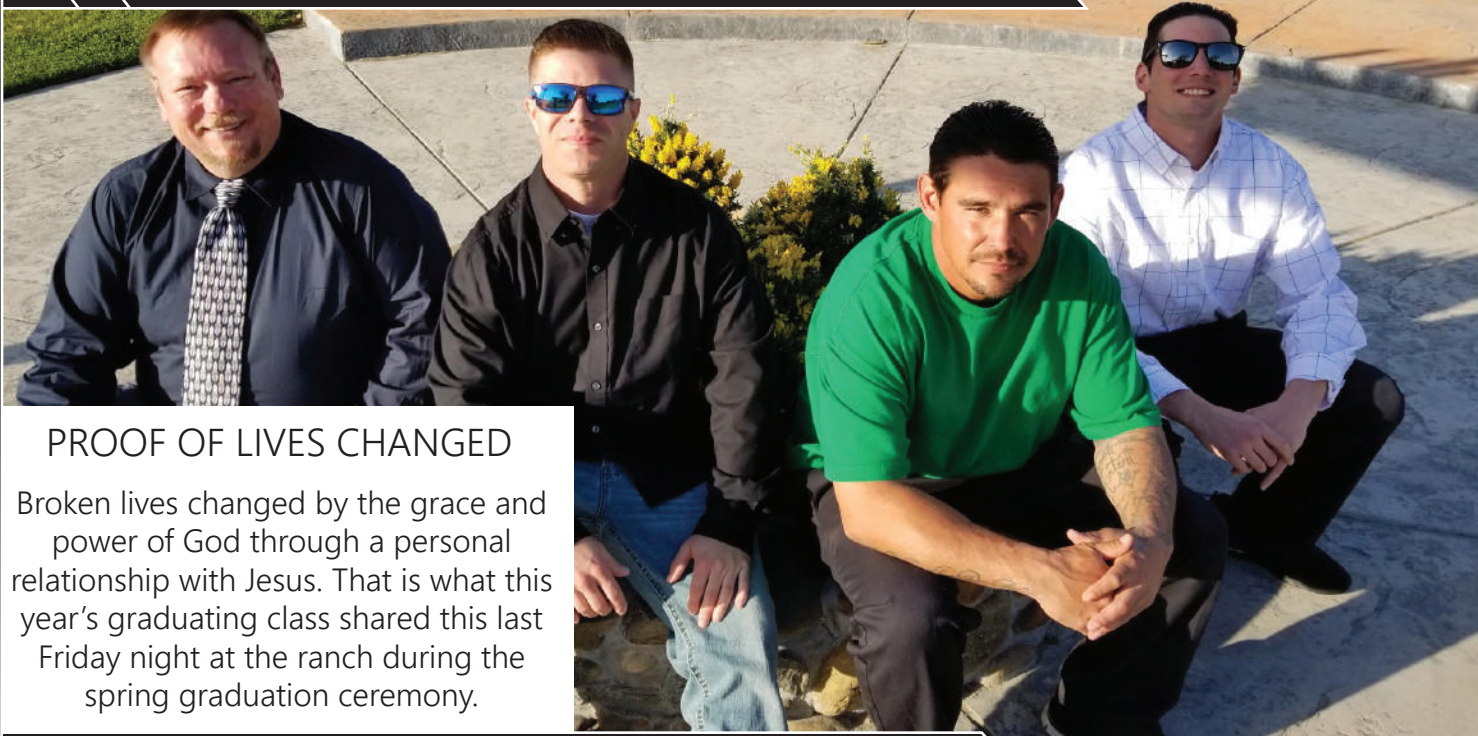

UPDATE ON THE STATE OF F.H.T.C.

I wanted to take this opportunity to give you a state of the ministry update. I have been the Executive Director for slightly over 1 year. The year has been fruitful, challenging, and has experienced much change.

The ranch itself looks great. We just had the first graduation ceremony on-site, and it could not have been more perfect.

We have seen growth in the following areas: New website; all of our published materials are uniform, fresh, and contemporary; our agriculture efforts are flourish-

ing; our staff is growing through our Emerging Leaders program, and we have built the restoring dignity program within the 12-16 month residency program for our Re-Entry Prep Phase students which assists them with employment opportunities and job readiness. We just finished our Spiritual Emphasis week and twice per month, on Sunday afternoons, we host family visitation days where students and their families worship together. We recently opened a Teen Challenge contact office in Jamestown, CA. on March 5th, 2018.

We are renovating many of our dormitories and living quarters, our served meals are healthy and desirable, lives are being changed, and families restored.

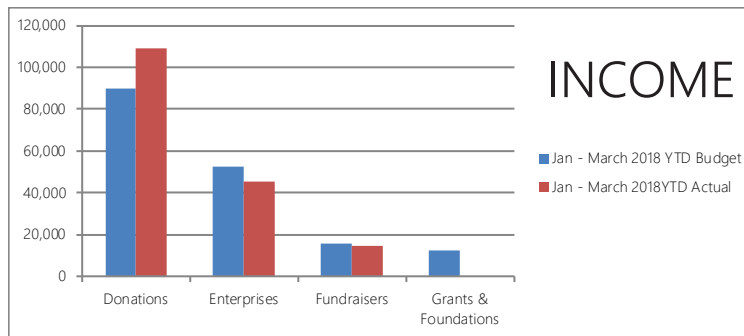
It would be too lengthy to recount all of the Lord's blessings for us, and for this reason we thank the Lord constantly.

Our financial challenge remains. You can see our income vs. expense report below. It costs over \$2,500 per month for each student to be here. We depend on donations, gifts, our enterprises, and foundations for financial support. We ended March even, but April has proven to be a battle.

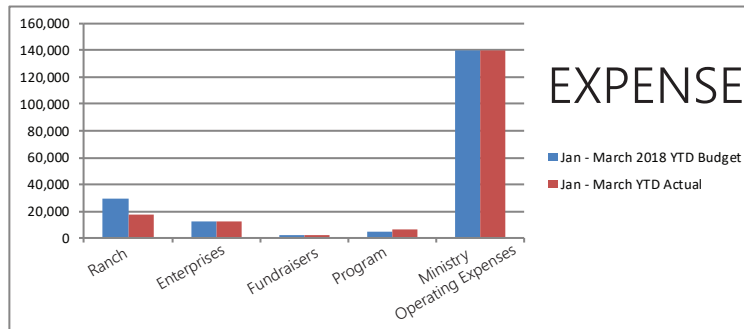
Our ministry restores hope, we reach men and their families. We turn no one away if they have no financial support, but we need more help. Our ministry impacts our local communities, but we are in need of more community support, more churches to invite us to come, more Christians to join with us in prayer and battle.
