As we settle in from the long and adventurous year, our new apiary is tucked in for the season. This means we get to take a breather from the inspections and let the ladies do their thing. We've lost a few hives and a few queens and endured plenty of stings, but nonetheless we made it through summer! Blessed with four, which was our ideal number to start with. We've learned a lot in our first season, and we're very excited for the next. We're already preparing for 2024 by extending the concrete pad for the apiary, and planting six acres of wildflowers, mustard seed and purple sunflowers that will bloom in spring. We expect to catch more swarms and split the hives we currently have.





With the help of some neighbors and friends for their skills and intelligence—Cover Crop for supplying the assorted seed for our six acres, and Garton Tractor for our New Holland that helped us prepare our soil—we were able to remove the old almond trees to make room for pollinators, not only for our hungry ladies but for the community that surrounds us as well. While we did get to have a small taste of the honey they produced, we decided to let them have it all to themselves to stay full and healthy throughout the winter. While the honey tastes amazing, we're hoping to expand our apiary to become local pollinators for the agricultural industry. But hopefully this upcoming harvest we'll have plenty to share, so prepare your taste buds! We'll be exploring some new skills in queen rearing, splitting, harvesting and other different methods of keeping our bees in a peaceful state of mind. Stay tuned!"
